These activities let the campers feel strong and powerful and forget about the hard times they're having with their health. Although my work experience was fun, there were parts that made me appreciate what I have. We made up and decorated the campers' cabins to give them a comfortable feel, made welcome cards... Throughout the week we had different guest speakers in to talk to us. We had Guarda Paul who told us about his time in Barretstown and how he overcame his illness, another speaker was a man called Mark who spoke about his son's stay in Barretstown and how the workers there made it enjoyable for him although he was very sick. Mark now does an annual swim for a fundraising event in memory of his son and donates all he makes to Barretstown.

I highly recommend doing your work experience, because it's something that will teach you so much, and it made me realize that I would like to do something to do with care after school.
